THE REV. DR. MARTIN R. NOLAND

The Rev. Dr. Martin R. Noland is the pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church, Evansville, Indiana. He has been a member of the LCMS clergy for thirty-two years. He was the Director of Concordia Historical Institute, Saint Louis, Missouri from 2002 to 2008. The Institute, which has been incorporated since 1927, is the Department of Archives and History of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. He received his Ph.D. degree in 1996 from The Union Theological Seminary in the City of New York in the field of Church History. This divinity school is one of the leading centers of Liberal Protestant theology in the United States and serves as Columbia University's constituent faculty of theology. Dr. Noland received his S.T.M. degree in 1986 from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana and his M.Div. degree in 1983 from the same school. He was an officer of the Board of Directors of the Luther Academy from 1993 to 2008. He has been an associate editor of "Logia: A Journal of Lutheran Theology" since 1996. He is presently a member of the Board of Directors of the Lutheran Concerns Association. He is the author of over two hundred articles on the Lutheran church, its history, its theology, and related topics. Dr. Noland was born in San Francisco and raised in San Jose, California. His wife is Karla Noland nee Kuhlman and they have three teenage daughters.
